## Constitutional and Legal Guarantees for Women's Representation and Participation

## CONSTITUTION

- Fundamental Rights Chapter

12(2): No citizen shall be discriminated against on the grounds of race, religion, language, caste, sex, political opinion, place of birth or any one of such grounds....

- Directive Principles of State Policy and Fundamental Duties

27(6): The State shall ensure equality of opportunity to citizens, so that no citizen shall suffer any disability on the ground of race, religion, language, caste, sex, political opinion or occupation.

PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS (AMENDMENT) ACT, NO. 58 OF 2009
7(4)(d): In order to guarantee better representation of women in political parties and in the politics, every recognized political party shall ensure the inclusion of one or more women office bearers in the list of office bearers of such party.

Observations: Out of 59 registered Political Parties, 26 parties (45\%) do not have a single woman representative.

Observation: There are 602 Governing Body members in registered political parties. Only 46 are women.

## Women in Governing Bodies of Political Parties



Observations: 26 Political Parties do not adhere to Party Registration Act.

Do Political Parties represented in 2015 Parliament, provide space for Women in their Governing Body?


Observation: Out of 14 Political Parties represented in Parliament, 5 Parties have not named a single woman in their decision-making structures (office bearers).

- In 2013, only 18 are women, reflecting 3.9 percent representation. In the Western Provincial council, the situation is comparatively better for women.

Recommendations for increased women's representation \& participation:
Based on experience and discussions with
Party Leaders, Secretaries and Political Representatives


- Reinforce Political Party Registration Act
i. Compulsory quota to incorporate women in executive body.
ii. Amend Political Party Registration Act to increase women's representation from 1 female to $30 \%$ women's representation and participation.
- Increase Intra-Party Democracy
i. There are women candidates with skills and capacities to hold decision-making positions
ii. Install transparent and democratic system to select Party Governing Body
- Opportunities and space created at ground level for women's capacity-building programs on leadership and political activism
- Women- and child-friendly environments created in Parliament, Provincial Councils and Local Authorities.
- Provide financial incentives and aid to women candidates

Canada has a financial assistance program that allows women and minority candidates to be reimbursed up to $\mathbf{C} \$ 500$ for child care expenses incurred in seeking a nomination, $\mathbf{C} \$ 500$ for travel costs in geographically large areas

- National List - At least every $3^{\text {rd }}$ person should be a female candidate in Political Party National List
- Political Parties to draft and endorse criteria for candidates (both male and female).
- Political Parties to allocate separate budget to strengthen women's representation and participation
- Every party should have a separate women's political wing.
